Paul Hafermann reported on the new WPPA membership "Buddy" program to be put into place prior to the Fall Convention. Dues are presently \$240 per year. An existing member may 'buddy' up with a new member (anyone who is not currently a paid member) and each can pay only \$99 for this coming year's membership. It will cover from the 2011 Fall Convention through the Fall Convention 2012 to include 3 convention periods. Their goal is to double the memberships in two years, giving more support to our vendors who make the conventions possible, as well as supporting our regional groups.
